



Check Out D.C.'s Biggest Ball Pit Under Construction Right Now

Starting July 4, you'll be able to go to the beach in Washington, D.C. with no sunscreen required. The National Building Museum is creating a new exhibit with design firm Snarkitecture that will fill a 10,000-square-foot space with an "ocean" of nearly one million recyclable translucent plastic balls. Some of the highlights to this installation include that it will have beach chairs and umbrellas, a mirrored wall to make the ball pit appear endless, and a concession stand operated through a partnership with Union Kitchen.
